

na⁴ḫar-gu₂-gil

neck ring, torc ('ring' + 'neck' + 'to cross; to lie athwart').

ḫAR-ḫa-da

a threshing sledge, *tribulum*, a raft-like lattice of staves bound in place with leather and with bitumen holding in place the thick flint blades inserted between the staves that cut the crop when dragged over the field by mules (millstone + many + with; cf., (ḡiš) za-ḫa-da, mur, and mur-gu₄; cf., Akkadian *mur(u)dū(m)*, 'lattice, grating', and *ḫarādu(m) III*, 'to fit together, fabricate, mat, battering ram').

ḡišḫar-ḫar

a musical instrument; chain (reduplicated 'ring, bracelet') (cf., *kikkīn₂*).

ḡišḫar-mušēn-na

bird snare ('ring' + 'bird' + genitive).

ḫar-ra-an; ḫa-ra-an

road, path, way; route, passage; journey, caravan (Akkadian loanword, *ḫarrānu(m)*, from a 5,000 year-old city at the intersection of trade routes to Anatolia and the Mediterranean, mentioned in mid-3rd millennium Ebla tablets as *ḫar-ra-nu^{ki}*).

ḫara₅

spout; vessel with a large spout (ḫa, optative prefix, + ra, 'to branch out from the side of').

ḫarub [DAG. KISIM₅ × U₂. ḡIR₂]

carob.

ḫaš, ḫaz

n., wood shavings; pieces of cut wood (ḫa₂, 'numerous', + ša₅, 'to cut, break' or ze₂, 'to cut, pluck').

v., to break or cut off (twigs, branches); to snap a reed; to clear away, strip off plants from land; to break up; to pulverize; to thresh grain.

ḫaš₂; ḫaš₄

lower abdomen; loins; back; upper thighs (ḫa₂, 'mixture', + a, 'water/urine', + še₁₀, 'excrement'; cf., etymology of ša₉).

ḫaš₄...dug₄/du₁₁/e

to have sexual relations ('loins' + 'to do').

ḫaš₄...ḡa₂-ḡa₂

to rejoice ('loins' + 'to place').

ḫaš₄...tal₂ [PI]

to rejoice ('upper thighs' + 'to spread, unfold').

(ḡiš) ḫašḫur

apple (tree); apples found dried and kept on strings in the Royal Cemetery of Ur (ḫaš, 'to break off (twigs or branches)', + gurun; gur₂, 'fruit; sphere') [ḫAŠḪUR archaic frequency: 101].

(ḡiš) ḫašḫur-kur-ra

pear (tree) (Akk. *kamiššaru(m)*); quince (tree) (Akk. *supurgillu(m)*); apricot (?) (tree) (Akk. *armannu(m)*) ('foreign apple', 'apple from the east').

(ḡiš) ḫašḫur-ma-da

pear (tree) (Akk. *kamiššaru(m)*) ('apple of the district').

ḫaz

(cf., ḫaš).

ḡišḫaz...aka

(cf., ḡiš-ḫaš...aka).

ḫe, ḫi

to mix [ḪI archaic frequency: 291].

ḫe(2)

abundance; abundant.

ḫe-bad^{mušēn}

a diving water-fowl ('numerous' + 'to go away').

ḫe₂

optative and affirmative verbal prefix; 'let it be', 'be it', 'indeed' (same as ḫa).

ḫe₂-...nam-...

let it be.
